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Built by Blohm & Voss Shipbuilders, Hamburg, Germany, 1902. 12,335 gross tons; 550 (bp) feet long; 60 feet wide. Steam quadruple expansion engines, twin screw. Service speed 16 knots. 2,102 passengers (333 first class, 169 second class, 1,600 third class). Two funnels and two masts. Steel hull, four decks, crew of 252.

Built for Hamburg-American Line, German flag, in 1902 and named **Moltke**. Hamburg-New York and Genoa-New York service. Seized by Italian Government, Italian flag, in 1915 and renamed **Pesaro**. Transferred to Lloyd Sabauda, Italian flag, in 1919. Italy-New York and Italy-South America service. Scrapped in Italy in 1925.
